

Third-Party Notification for Discontinuance of Service

The Public Utilities Commission for the State of Colorado has in effect a decision regarding discontinuance of service. This decision, known as Rule 13, requires the utility to furnish a third-party notification form to all members. This form will be used to notify a third party prior to discontinuance of service in instances when the member cannot be notified. Each consumer will be responsible for returning a third-party notification form to the utility if he or she wishes to have a third party notified. The form shall be signed by both the member (or his/her legal representative) and by the third party to be notified in the event of possible discontinuance of service.

This rule shall not apply where a by-pass is discovered on a member's premises, or in the case of a member utilizing service in such a manner as to make it dangerous for occupants of the premises. In these cases, an immediate discontinuance of service to the premises will be imperative.

STATEMENT OF NONDISCRIMINATION
